RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE LOCAL ANTI-CRIMINALITY ACTION PLAN (LACAP) OF THE NARVACAN POLICE (THEFT AND ROBBERY)

WHEREAS, the Local Anti-Criminality Action Plan (LACAP) (Theft and Robbery) prescribes the guidelines and procedures as to the importance of Close Circuit Television (CCTV) in the prevention of all forms of criminality and in aid on the solution through identification of the perpetrators under holistic criminality approach of Narvacan Police Station putting emphasis on the Theft and Robbery;

WHEREAS, Narvacan is a developing community with a growing economic and tourism potential with a total population of 46,413 while there a ratio at present of 1:1934 providing public safety which is considered undermanned. The standard ratio is 1:500 which consequently leaving the municipality vulnerable to crime incidents;

WHEREAS, there are regions that are already regions that are victimized by the organized robbery/theft group which is alarming with regards to public safety that they become serious threats to the populace especially those engaged in business;


WHEREAS, Narvacan Police Station has to make necessary measures to such as the installation of Close Circuit Televisions (CCTV). The adoption of this LACAP Plan and this modern technology is a very effective procedure in addressing issues on all forms of criminality by installing the CCTV along places of convergence and on business establishments within the municipality to monitor movements of lawless elements as they execute and likewise as an aid in police investigations in identifying perpetrators;

NOW THEREFORE, the Sangguniang Bayan of Narvacan, Ilocos Sur, in session duly assembled and on motion by SBM Rafael C. Cachola, and unanimously approved by the SB Council **RESOLVED AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** to adopt the Local Anti-Criminality Action Plan (LACAP) versus Theft and Robbery of the Narvacan Police;







**Installation of Close Circuit Televisions (CCTV) on
Places of Convergence, Vital Installations and
Business Establishments**

I. REFERENCE:

II. PURPOSE

This Action Plan prescribes the guidelines and procedures as to the importance of Close Circuit Television in the prevention all forms of criminality and to aid on its solution through identification of the perpetrators under holistic anti-criminality approach of Narvacan Municipal Police Station putting emphasis on Theft and Robbery committed within AOR.

III. SITUATION

The Municipality of Narvacan is a developing community with a growing economic and tourism potentials, with the total population of 46,413. It has a police to population ratio of 1:1934 providing public safety is an utmost challenge and predicament to the local police, consequently leaving the municipality vulnerable to crime incidents that may affect the peace and order situation within the area of jurisdiction especially.

Cities of Vigan and Candon as well as the Municipality of Bauang, La Union and other provinces in the region has been victimized by the organized robbery/theft group which become alarming with regards to public safety concern. The criminals were able to flee at the crime scenes leaving these as serious threats

to the populace especially those engage in businesses that disrupted law and order, consequently the public perception. Common perceptions blamed it on the part of the PNP which is an indication of poor and inefficient deployments of patrollers and the worse, they did not make any measure to preempt those acts, which reflects how the chief of police supervise its subordinates.

On 2013 Rang-ay Bank in Sta Cruz, Ilocos Sur was victimized by the infamous Acetylene Gang their modus was the group tunnelled a hole in the adjacent Avon Establishment going to the bank however the act was foiled when a delivery of merchandises at Avon was made. The robbery was not consummated, and a case was filed against the perpetrator/s.

On November 14, 2016 Sta Cruz was again victimized by the Acetylene Gang this time the victims were HL Lhuillier Pawnshop and Farmacia Monlyzamae, the notorious group used the sewerage/drainage and made a tunnel going to the pawnshop and subsequently made a hole from the vault room to FarmaciaMonlyzamae.

Narvacan MPS has to make necessary measures to solve these issues which is only limited to police presence, Police Community Relations and conduct of Security Survey and Inspection to give reminders and suggestions to Business Owners and Vital Installation Managers on the defects that are merely observe during patrolling, visits and inspections wherein most of their experiences only few have complied.

Modern technology has a big contribution on the day to day activity of an individual. To keep abreast with the challenge of the changing time, it is but fitting to adopt the benefits of modern technology in addressing issues on all forms of criminality within the municipality. It is therefore imperative to install Close Circuit Television along places of convergence, and on business establishments within the municipality to monitor the movements of lawless elements as they execute or planning to execute their nefarious plans in victimizing the community which will also be used as an aid in police investigations in identifying the perpetrators.

IV. MISSION

Narvacan MPS concurrent with its mission and functions and in coordination with the Local Government Unit (LGU), and its Sangguniang Bayan (SB) Council, Other Law Enforcement Agencies (OLEAs), Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) shall intensify its Public Safety and Security emphasizing on the security of all Vital Installations and Major Business Establishments within the AOR by incorporating an installed Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras as a requirement in acquiring business permits to address criminal activity in the locality.

I. Execution:

A. Concept of Operations

Narvacan Municipal Police Station, in coordination with the LGU, and SB council, business entities and stakeholders shall enhance the security of all Vital Installations, and Major Business Establishments by; Liaising with the LGU and SB council in the approval of this Local Anti-Criminality Action Plan (LACAP) subsequent to the adoption/conversion and enactment of Municipal Ordinance mandating all Vital Installations and business entities to install CCTVs in their respective establishments.

Senior PNCO's and operations/Plan PNCO will be tasked to coordinate for the mobilization of Barangay Tanods as force multipliers who will be conducting patrol duties in the different barangays within the area and specially with the business areas.

Likewise, dialogues (pulong- pulong) will be conducted in all barangays as part of the education and information drive to raiser community awareness and support to the implementation of Anti- Criminality Campaign, through collaboration with concerned sectors of society and organizations of government.

B. Tasking

1. **OIC- Overall Task Group Supervisor**
2. **Deputy COP – Asst Task Group Supervisor**
 - a. Assist the Officer-In-Charge in the implementation of this LACAP;
 - b. Designated as the Task Group Commander
3. **Operations Section**
 - a. Task Group Supervisor for Operation;
 - b. Submit Local Anti-Criminality Action Plan
 - c. Oversee and monitor the implementation of this LACAP;
 - d. Deploy dedicated PNP personnel to conduct patrol duties
 - e. Ensure maximum deployment of personnel and augmentation of personnel in case needed.
 - f. Conduct regular consultation with POCs and Development Councils;

- g. Undertake activities that will pursue proactive measures defensive measures and community organization in policing;
- h. Perform other task on orders;

4. Intelligence Section

- a. Task Group Supervisor for Intelligence;
- b. Strengthen CI operations to identify person/group involve in robbery operating within the municipality and nearby towns
- c. Provide timely and accurate intelligence information;
- d. Maintain updated target list of suspected crime groups involved in robbery and theft
- e. Perform other task on orders;

5. Police Community Relations Section

- a. Task Group Supervisor for PCR;
- b. Orchestrate a wide public information campaign through the local media in order to raise public awareness and solicit community support for the prevention of this kind of criminal activity;
- c. Operationalize/organize the BPATs in their respective Barangays and other force multipliers of the City/Municipalities in coordination with the LGU's;
- d. Perform other task as necessary;

6. Investigation Section

- a. Designated as Task Group Supervisor for Investigation;
- b. Conduct speedy investigation and file appropriate charges in court against suspects if evidence warrants Perform other task on orders;
- c. Perform other task as necessary

7. Logistics Section

- a. Provide appropriate logistical support;
- b. Provide logistical support to operating troops;
- c. Ensure operational readiness of equipment;
- d. Perform other task on orders;

8. Finance Section

- a. Provide funds if necessary;
- b. Perform other task on orders;

9. Municipal Peace and Order Council (MPOC)

- a. Convene the council members for inputs and subsequent approval of the Action Plan taking into consideration the responsibility of all concerned for a holistic and effective approach to the situation and undertake activities that will pursue proactive measures defensive measures and community organization in policing;
- b. Convene on a regular basis or when the need arises, to conduct assessment on the affectivity of the plan and to make the necessary adjustment as necessary.

10. **Sanguniang Bayan (SB)**

- a. Enact ordinances for the adoption of the MPOC approved Action Plan for the provision for the support for its implementation, to include the training and mobilization of barangay tanods/police as force multipliers and provide regular funding to be used by the PNP for intel monitoring and inspections for the efficiency of the installed cctv's and on the conduct of a regular review on the footages in every establishments.

11. **Coordinating Instructions**

- a. Police Operational Procedures and other applicable SOPs on the conduct of the action plan shall be strictly observed at all times;
- b. Respect for human rights is paramount and must be observed under all circumstances at all times.
- c. All uniformed personnel shall strictly observed "TAMANG BIHIs"
- d. Lateral coordination is highly encouraged.
- e. All reports shall be submitted to the Chief of Police prior submission to PPO.

VII. EFFECTIVITY:

This LACAP shall take effect immediately upon approval
